About Al-Ma'thurat

Al-Ma'thurat is a compilation of adkhar (sing. *dhikr*) and ad'iyah (sing. *du'a*) derived from the Glorious Qur'an and the authentic sayings (*ahadith*) of Prophet Muhammad \bigotimes , to be recited mornings and evenings.

Al-Ma'thurat is the title of a short work compiled by Imam Shaheed Hasan Al-Banna (1906-1949), the founder of the Ikhwan, who strove to establish the perpetual remembrance of Allah in all spheres of life.

Al-Ma'thurat is an answer to every Muslim's need for a daily portion of *dhikr*—remembrance of Allah, Exalted and High—so that he or she can maintain a strong, steadfast connection with Him throughout daily life. For the Muslim activist, this connection with Allah is critical. Imam Al-Banna recognized the need for a daily portion of remembrance based upon authentic hadeeth— sayings of the Prophet . MAS encourages every Muslim to adopt a daily portion of remembrance and practice it devoutly, whether individually or in a group.

This is an abridged version of Al-Ma'thurat known as "Al-Wazifa as-Sughra." Included in the original work was an introduction to the merits of remembering Allah, the proper etiquette for supplication, and a selection of other daily supplications based on authentic Prophetic sources.

About the Author

Imam Shaheed Hasan Al-Banna was a twentieth-century Islamic revivalist and the founder of the *Ikhwan* (Muslim Brotherhood), the largest and most influential Islamic movement in recent history. Formed in Egypt in 1928, the *Ikhwan* is a grassroots movement whose aim is to revive Islamic societies and bring about social reform and a return to divine guidance. Imam Al-Banna was assassinated in 1949 and is considered by many scholars a mujaddid--reviver of Islam--of the previous century.

On the authority of Abu Huraira 💥 the Prophet 🎇 said "Verily, Allah 🞉 will send for this Ummah every one hundred years who will revive for it it's Deen." (Abu Dawud – Hadith Sahih).

Under Imam Al-Banna's leadership, the movement produced a wealth of contemporary scholarship and valuable experience that awakened and indeed continues to inspire Islamic revival movements across the globe. Imam Al-Banna said, "Whenever you find the good Muslim you find with him all the means for great success."

"Umar, are you sleeping?" he asked through a whispered murmur.

"No." I answered. The day had been long and relentless. It was already so late. I was getting ready to sleep, mindful that the day ahead wouldn't be any less arduous. Twenty or thirty minutes passed in silence.

"Umar, are you sleeping?"

"No!" I answered a second time. It became quite once again. I didn't grasp the urgency in his voice but remained silent anyway. Half an hour passed by again.

"Umar, are you sleeping?"

This time I didn't respond at all. I pretended to sleep so as not to bother him. Waiting for a reply and hearing none, he presumed that I had fallen asleep. He arose in the still of the night, without making a sound, alone, beside his companion whom he thought was in a deep slumber, and started to perform the night prayer. For God only, oblivious to my attentive gaze, hidden from anyone's gaze."

It is Ustadh Umar Al-Tilmisani (1904-1986), an old time student and travelling companion (*Murshid*, General Guide, of the *Ikhwan* 1972-1986)

of Imam Hasan Al-Banna who provides us with this story. The attitude of his master was enough to move him to tears. It exemplified the personality of Imam Hasan Al-Banna: light-giving faith, a deep spirituality, personal discipline, gentle and soft with his fellow human beings. Ustadh Umar Al-Tilmisani wrote this story and repeated it often.

The secret of Imam Hasan Al-Banna was the quality of his faith and the intensity of his relationship with God. Anyone who had ever been in contact with him perceived and experienced this. He lived as had the first Sahaba - following the path of the Prophet 🔆 .



Anas ﷺ reported that the Messenger of Allah ﷺ said: "Whoever says when he rises up in the morning: [this du'a] will be protected from the satan till the evening." Related by Ibn Sunni.

^{2.} Surah Al-Fatihah – Ubay ibn Ka'b 🐲 reported that the Messenger of Allah 👹 said: "By Him in Whose Hand is my soul, nothing like it was revealed in the Torah, Gospel, Psalms, or the Furqan. It is the seven oft-repeated verses and the Formidable Qur'an which I have been given." Related by Tirmidhi

He will (also) see nothing he dislikes in his family and his wealth." Related by Bayhaqi.

Allah! There is no god but He, the Living, the Self Sufficient. Neither slumber nor sleep overtakes Him. To Him belongs all that is in the heavens and on earth. Who can intercede in His presence except as He permits? He knows what is in front of them and what is behind them while they can attain none of His knowledge except as He wills. His Throne extends over the heavens and the earth, and He is never weary of preserving them

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for He is the Most High, the Supreme. There is no compulsion in religion. The right guidance is henceforth distinct from error. Whoever rejects evil and believes in Allah has grasped the most trustworthy support that never breaks. And Allah is the All-Hearing, the All-Knowing. Allah is the protecting ally of those who believe; from the depths of darkness He leads them into the light. As for those who reject truth, their allies are the devils who take them out of the light and into the darkness. Such are the dwellers of the fire; in it they shall abide for ever.

^{4.} Ayat Al-Kursi – Ubay ibn Ka'b # reported that the Messenger of Allah # once asked: "Abul Mundhir, do you know which verse of the Book of Allah that you have is the greatest?" I said: Allah and His Messenger know best. He repeated his question and I said: "Alah, there is no God but He, the Living, the Sustainer ? There-upon he struck me on the breast saying: 'May knowledge be your delight, Oh Abul Mundhir!'" Related by Muslim.

They all believe in Allah, His angels, His books, and His messengers. [They say] "We make



no distinction between one and another of His messengers." And they say: "We hear and we obey, we seek Your forgiveness, our Lord, and to You is the end of all journeys." Allah does not impose on any soul a burden greater than it can bear. It receives every good that it earns, and it suffers every ill that it earns. [Pray:] Our Lord! Do not condemn us if we forget or fall into error; our Lord! Do not lay on us a burden like that which You laid on those before us; our Lord! Do not lay on us a burden greater than we have strength to bear. Pardon us, forgive us, and have mercy on us. You are our guardian, so grant us victory over the unbelievers.

^{5.} Last two verses from Surah Al-Baqarah – Abu Mas'ud 🕮 reported that the Messenger of Allah 🏶 said: "If anyone recites the last two verses of Surah Al-Baqarah at night, they will avert harm from him." Related by Tirmidhi.

Ten verses of Surah Al-Baqarah – Ad-Daarimi recorded that Ash-Sha'bi said that Abdullah ibn Mas'ud said, "Whoever recites ten ayaat from Surah Al-Baqarah in a night then shaytaan will not enter his house that night (these 10 ayaat are) four from the beginning, Ayat Al-Kursi (255), The following two ayaat (256 – 257) and the last three ayaat" Related by Musnad Ad-Daarimi.



Anas ibn Malik 🎉 reported that a person said to the Messenger of Allah 🏐 that he loves this surah. The Messenger of Allah 🏐 said: "Your love for this surah will take you to Paradise." Related by Tirmidhi

Surah Al-Ikhlaas, Al-Falaq, and An-Nas – The Messenger of Allah 3 said, "Read Surah Ikhlas, Surah Al-Falaq, and Surah An-Naas three times in the morning and in the evening. It will make you sufficient of everything (i.e. your requirements will be fulfilled)." Related by Tirmidhi

Other Du'a

Asbahnaa (amsaynaa)* wa asbah (amsaa)* almulku lillah, wal hamdulillah, la sharika lahu, la ilaha illa huwa wa ilayhi annushur (almaseer)*.

We rose up in the morning (reached this evening) and so has Allah's domain. Gratitude is due to Allah, He has no partner. There is no god but He, and onto Him is the return (destiny).

Asbahnaa (Amsaynaa)* `ala fitrat alislam, wa kalimat al-ikhlas, wa `ala deeni nabiyyina muhammad sallallahu alayhi wa sallam, wa `ala millati abeena ibrahima hanifa wama kana min almushrikeen.

We have risen this morning (reached this evening) in the pure state of Islam, with the word of sincerity, on the religion of our Prophet Muhammad, may Allah's blessings and peace be upon him, and in the faith of our father Ibrahim, who was upright in truth and who was not of those who associate partners with Allah.

^{10.} Abu Hurayrah 😻 said: "The Messenger of Allah 🐺 when he rose in the morning, used to say [this dua]. When the evening approaches, he used to say [this dua]." Related by Ibn Sunni and Bazzar.

^{11.} Ubay Ibn Ka'b 🎉 said that "the Messenger of Allah 👺 taught us to say [this dua] when we rise in morning, and to say the same when one reaches the evening." Related by Abdullah Ibn Imam Ahmad in his Zawaid.


^{12.} Abdullah Ibn Umar *mathefinity* narrated that the Messenger of Allah *space* space to them about a servant from amongst the servants of Allah who said: [this dua], and this became problematic between two angels, for they did not know how to write it. They ascended to the Heavens and said: "Oh our Lord! Your servant has said something that we do not know how to write (record)?" Allah *space* and the is the Most Knowledgeable about what His servant has said: "What has My servant said?" They replied: "Oh Lord! He said: [this dua]." Thereupon Allah *space* said to them "Write it down as my servant has said it so that when he meets Me, I will give the reward for it." Related by Imam Ahmad and Ibn Majah.

^{13.} Ibn Abbas 🐲 narrated that the Messenger of Allah 🐲 said: "Whoever says: [this dua], three times when he wakes up in the morning and when he reaches the evening, it will become a right upon Allah to complete His blessings upon him." Related by Ibn Sunni.

^{14.} Abdullah Ibn Ghanam Al-Bayadi 🎉 narrated that the Messenger of Allah 🏶 said: "Whoever says when he wakes up in the morning: [this dua], has fulfilled his (duty of) thanks (to Allah) for the day; and the one who says the same when evening arrives has fulfilled his (duty of) thanks (to Allah) for the night." Related by Abu Dawud, Nisa'i, and Ibn Hibbani.







- 1. Rise to the prayer upon hearing the call (adhan) (or upon its appointed time) regardless of the circumstances.
- 2. Recite the Qur'an. Read (study), listen (to useful things), or remember Allah (dhikr). Do not waste any of your time without doing something of benefit.
- 3. Strive to speak (or at least learn) classical Arabic because it is one of the symbols of Islam.
- 4. Avoid argumentation (regardless of the subject) for it leads to no good.
- 5. Avoid excessive laughter. The heart is connected to Allah is calm and tranquil.
- 6. Do not spend your time joking. The people of striving are ever serious.
- 7. Speak so that your listener or listeners can hear you and do not raise your voice beyond that. Speaking with excessive loudness is insensitive and offensive to others.
- 8. Avoid backbiting individuals and defaming other groups and organizations. Speak only when you have something good to say.
- 9. Foster ties of loving brotherhood with any of your brothers that you meet without waiting for others to ask this of you. Indeed this love and familiarity is the foundation of our Call (Da'wah).
- 10 We have more responsibilities than time. Help others to benefit from the time that they do have. If you need something from another person, do all you can so that it takes up as little time as possible.
